support.**



CT COURSE DESCRIPTIONS FOR CLASSES

CT 6141 Academic Foundations: Academic Writing and Scholarship

2 Units, Fall 2016

This course is designed to demystify academic writing in English in a safe, supportive, and rigorous workshop environment. Such genres as the critical reflection essay, research paper, and stages of the dissertation will be discussed and explored. Additionally, this course will provide an opportunity for students to complete a substantial writing project related to their own scholarly work.

CT 6802 Academic Foundations: Integral Pedagogy

2 Units, Spring 2017

Designed for students exploring professional teaching paths, and students invested in deepening their understandings of integral pedagogy, this course will explore a number of integral and experiential approaches to teaching and learning.

CT 6468 Academic Foundations: Composition and Communication Skills

2 Units, Summer 2017

Designed for students interested in developing and honing their foundational writing skills, this course will assist writers in the clear communication of ideas and concepts. The course focuses on supporting international students, non-native speakers of English, and students cultivating their composition and writing skills.

CT (6469) Academic Foundations: Integrative Research Methodology

2 Units, Semester TBD

After providing a general introduction to research methodology, this course outlines major philosophical assumptions of the integral worldview and their implications for integral epistemology and integrative methodology.

All courses meet in person; currently, the WSE department offers PARW 6027, a 1-unit online "Foundational Elements of Academic Writing and Research" course for the online student community in fall semesters.
